


# "Purpose"

### His sculptures are a full-body effort

#### Hsu Yunghsu of Taiwan will make his debut at Art Basel Hong Kong

For his debut at Art Basel Hong Kong, the Tanwanese artist Hau Yunghau and the Taipei gallery representing him decided to go big. Really big.

The centerpiece of his six works on view at the art fair will be "2021-3" a stoneware sculpture with swirling, cocoon-like sections that Mr. Hsu molded and squeezed together with the power of not just his fingers, but his entire body. Standing about 10 feet high and 8 feet wide, the work is made up of two 650pound pieces stacked vertically, making it far from a typical piece of art to make a

journey of any length to a global art lair. Yet \*2021-3\* is typical of the uncorventional art Mr. Hou (pronounced SHOO), 67, is known for, and his ambitions way of molding, chiling and purching it together. Liang Gallery in Taipei, which will also feature seven other artists in its section, including the video artist Ting Tong Chang, will display two other clay and three percelain sculptures by Mr. Hau, ranging in length or beight from less than one foot to nearly five feet. Each has a similar motif; swirling masses of what could be seen as a group of cells, with light and shadow

darking off dozens of angles.

The sculpture "2021-3," whose title simply signifies that it is the third piece of art Mr. Hau produced in 2021, resembles a giant, undulating sponge crossed with a chunk of coral seef. Featuring his technique writ large, it has thousands of surface, kneaded into the clay. The cascading avals and curves are stacked, but the thickness of some negments is only third of an inch, creating a delicacy that

Like "2021-3," many of his works from the last several years have swirling, empty pads that feel safe and inviting. They have become his cen-






